Jointly provided study programmes in foreign languages

1. Francophone study

This study is designed for Bachelor and Master/Engineer students with the aim to enable the students of the Faculty of Economics to get broader and more comprehensive knowledge of specific economic subjects in French and of French economic terminology. The Faculty of Economics offers students the opportunity to complete part of economic subjects in French and obtain a certificate of completion of Francophone study, a university diploma of Francophone economic studies from the Poitiers University, or a double diploma in the jointly provided Master study programme Gestion financière et espace européen from the University of Lorraine and Matej Bel University, Faculty of Economics.

2. Jointly provided Master/Engineer study programme Marketing Management of Business

This programme is provided by Matej Bel University, Faculty of Economics, in Banská Bystrica together with the Polish partner university Economic University, Faculty of Management, in Cracow.

3. Jointly provided Master/Engineer study programme Economics and Management of Tourism

This programme is provided by Matej Bel University, Faculty of Economics, in Banská Bystrica together with the Catholic University Eichstaett-Ingolstadt in Germany.

4. Jointly provided Master/Engineer study programme Territorial Studies

This study programme is jointly provided by the Reims Champagne-Ardenne University (France) and Matej Bel University, Faculty of Economics, in Banská Bystrica.

Admission requirements

Bachelor study

The admission requirements apply equally to all Bachelor study programmes of the Faculty of Economics of Matej Bel University.

The basic condition required by law is the completion of the secondary education. Another requirement of the Faculty for full-time study is passing the entrance exam.

The entrance exam consists of written tests in one foreign language, mathematics and the basics of economics. The foreign language can be chosen from English, French, German, Russian or Spanish. The maximum score in each of the tests is 60 points, and for grade point average from secondary school, 20 points.

The candidates will be admitted to study in accordance to the ranking of their total scores until the planned capacity of individual study programmes in individual forms of study is fulfilled.

The entrance exam can be replaced by the test of General Academic Prerequisites (GAP) – the candidate can be admitted to the study at the Faculty of Economics in the case of having reached a percentile of 50 and higher. The GAP test can be taken within the National Comparative Exams provided by the Scio assessment centre at several places in Slovakia and the Czech Republic in six different dates during the academic year 2015/2016. The test can be taken more than once and the best result will be counted.

The applicants for part-time study will be admitted to study without an entrance exam.

In case the number of applicants exceeds the planned number for admission, the Dean of the Faculty has the right to decide to admit the students according to their grade point average from secondary school.

The Dean can exempt from the entrance exam the applicants who had previously passed the entrance exam, and had been admitted and enrolled in the study and were expelled from study.

Master study

The admission requirements apply equally to all Master study programmes at the Faculty of Economics of Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica.

The basic requirement is the completion of a Bachelor study programme. Another requirement is passing the entrance exam.

The entrance exam consists of a written test in major subjects of the Bachelor study in the particular field of study. The maximum score in the entrance exam is 100 points.

The applicants who completed the Bachelor study in the same field of study shall be admitted without the entrance exam. In the case of applicants who completed the Bachelor study in a different field of study, the decision about admitting them with or without entrance exam is the right of the Dean.

In case the number of applicants accepted without entrance exam is higher than the planned capacity of the study programme, the Dean has the right to decide according to the candidates' grade point average from Bachelor study.

The candidates who have passed the entrance exam will be admitted to study according to a ranking compiled on the basis of their total scores up to the planned capacity of individual study programmes.

The Dean can exempt from the entrance exam the applicants who had previously passed the entrance exam, and had been admitted and enrolled in the study and were expelled from study.

Doctoral (PhD) study

The admission requirements apply equally to all Doctoral study programmes at the Faculty of Economics of Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica.

The basic requirement for admission to doctoral study is the completion of a second-degree university study programme. Another requirement of the Faculty is passing the entrance exam.

Before starting the admission procedure, the Faculty issues a list of dissertation topics to be chosen by the applicants within the admission process; each topic has a supervisor. The applicant is obliged to sign up for one of the topics.

The entrance exam is combined and consists of the following parts:

- a) Written test in one foreign language (English, French, German, Russian or Spanish)
- b) Written test in economic theory
- c) Presentation of a written project of the dissertation
- d) Assessment of the candidate's publication, research and professional activity
- e) Assessment of the candidate's grade point average from the Master study.

Applicants for full-time study will take the entrance exam in parts a) – d) and applicants for part-time study will take the entrance exam in parts c) and d). Applicants from Slovakia shall present the project in the Slovak or a world language, and applicants from abroad in a world language.

The maximum number of points for candidates in full-time form of study is 100 (the sum for parts a) – d)), and for candidates in part-time form of study the maximum number of points is 50 points (the sum for parts c) and d)).

The maximum points for individual parts of entrance exam:

- a) Written test in the foreign language: 20 points
- b) Written test in economic theory: 20 points
- c) Presentation of a written project of the dissertation: 40 points, out of which:
 - theoretical background of research: 10 points
 - projected objectives: 10 points,
 - projected methods of research: 10 points
 - presentation of the project: 10 points.

- d) Research activities during the Master study, e.g. a work within student scientific activity, an excellent grade (A) for diploma work granted by the supervisor, opponent and state exam board, involvement in a research project, publication of papers, etc.: 10 points
- e) Grade point average from the Master study (grades for individual subjects and the state exam): 10 points.

The entrance exam is supervised by the admission board, which compiles a ranking of candidates on the basis of their total scores and recommends to either accept the candidate for doctoral study, or not.

The candidates will be admitted to study in accordance to the ranking of their total scores until the planned capacity of individual study programmes in individual forms of study is fulfilled. On admission of the candidate to doctoral study, the Dean will notify the candidate about the topic of their dissertation, supervisor, institution providing the study, duration of study, and with full-time doctoral students, also the place of study.

The members of the admission board are appointed by the Dean of the Faculty on the basis of the proposal from the doctoral study programme supervisor which has been considered and approved by a particular study board. With the consent of the chair, the board can invite the supervisor whose topic has been chosen by the candidate to be a member of the board.

Accommodation and meals for students

The students of the Faculty of Economics of Matej Bel University can use the possibility of accommodation in student homes and take meals in student canteens.

Employment of graduates

The economic education, general knowledge and practical skills and intensive language training offers the graduates from the Faculty of Economics an excellent chance to find a job at home and abroad, in economic and managerial positions of the middle and top management in tourism, companies, tax and customs offices, in the financial market and commercial banking, in public services and regional development organizations and in state and local government.
