General information on admission proceedings (Bachelor's degree study)

- All applicants must undergo admission proceedings.
- If an applicant applies via the electronic application, they are also obliged to send a printed application to the Faculty. The printed application must be fully filled in, personally signed and must contain all required attachments. **An electronic application without a printed counterpart** received by the Admission Office is **invalid**.
- **The application must contain:**
 - the CV of the applicant
 - a copy of the receipt for the admission proceedings fee payment (the payment must be wired, postal money orders cannot be accepted)

- a certified copy of the high school leaving exam certificate
- Applicants who do not present evidence of meeting the basic requirements for study admission until the given deadline will be **accepted conditionally**. Applicants are obliged to present a certified copy of a high school leaving exam certificate **at the latest by the enrolment day**, otherwise they cannot begin their study.
- Applicants who completed their high school studies abroad are obliged to present an acceptance confirmation of their foreign certificate. The decision on acceptance shall be presented by the applicant at the latest on the enrolment day.

Basic conditions of acceptance for Bachelor's degree study

- completed high school education or vocational education with a leaving certificate
- meeting requirements of the admission proceedings.

Basic conditions of acceptance pertaining to foreign students:

- successful passing of admission procedure
- acceptance confirmation of a certificate on high school education completed abroad.

Conditions of admission proceedings in the 2016/2017 academic year

Slovak Language and Culture for Foreign Students – without an admission exam.

The basic admission precondition for a Bachelor's degree study is completed high school education or vocational education equivalent to the Slovak educational system and its requirements. If the number of applicants exceeds the planned number of students in the given study programme, they will be accepted based on the average of their high school leaving examination (or its foreign counterpart) results.

Profile of the graduate

Graduates of the Slovak Language and Culture for Foreign Students study programme will possess general knowledge of the Slovak language (level C2), linguistic competence focused on communication as well as sociolinguistic and pragmatic competences in accordance with CEFR levels (level C2).

Graduates in the labour market

The linguistic and sociocultural competence in the Slovak language as a modern European language will provide the graduates of the Slovak Language and Culture for Foreign Students study programme with the opportunity to work as:

- intercultural mediators in various areas of social life as well as non-profit organisations
- cultural and awareness-raising workers in lower management at municipal or regional levels
- coordinators of cultural and economic relationships mediating foreign communication
- public administration and local self-government employees mediating international cooperation at municipal or regional levels thanks to their ability to establish contacts with foreign institutions
- translators capable of dealing with simple documents
