Based on the decision of the Faculty's management, the second round for filing an application can be announced for individual Bachelor's and Master's programmes.

In case of low interest in the study program, the dean of the faculty reserves the right not to open the given study program. Another study program will be offered to the applicant.

Graduates of the Doctoral degree have completed the third degree of tertiary education. The graduate of the Doctoral study will be awarded the academic degree of Doctor ("philosophiae doctor", in short form "PhD").

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admission – General information

The admission procedure provides an opportunity for candidates to prove that they meet certain admission requirements for study in order to become a student of a chosen study programme at the Faculty.

The admission procedure begins after the candidate delivers his / her written application for study to the Faculty.

Candidates file the application

- in electronic form (information about the electronic admission and required enclosures will be published on the Faculty's website);
- or in paper form (current application form for universities can be downloaded from the Ministry of Education webpage).

EF UMB prefers applications in electronic form.

Candidates may only submit one application at one level of study and to one study programme.

The application must be sent to the Faculty by these deadlines – for the first and second level degree programmes, the deadline is prolonged until 30 April 2022. For the 3rd level degree programmes, the deadline is 27th May 2022.

Students who have completed the previous degree abroad must have the diploma recognised in the Slovak Republic. The admitted students shall submit the document recognising the diploma no later than the day of enrolment.

Applicant, who has completed a previous level of education in a country outside the European Higher Education Area, is required to attach to his/her application form a notarized photocopy of the internationally accepted IELTS certificate - International English Language Testing System with a minimum entry score of at least 6,0 from all parts no later than April 30, 2022. A notarized photocopy of the certificate must be delivered to the faculty in a paper version (the electronic version is not sufficient) no later than April 30, 2022. The certificate sent only in the electronic version will not be accepted and the applicant's application form will be canceled.

Admission to Bachelor's studies

The admission requirements apply equally to all Bachelor's programmes of the Faculty of Economics of Matej Bel University.

The basic condition is the completion of secondary education. The candidate who fails to prove in time that he / she meets the admission requirements can be conditionally admitted to study if they do so on the day of enrolment for study at the latest.

Another requirement of the Faculty for full-time study is passing the entrance exam.

The entrance exam consists of written tests in one foreign language and the basics of economics. The foreign language can be chosen from English, German or Russian. The maximum score in each of the tests is 100 points.

Students interested in the Business Economics and Management programme in English will take the entrance exam in English (written tests in the English language and economics).

The total points of the candidate are calculated as the sum of the points earned in both parts of the entrance exam. The minimum points for passing the entrance exam and admitting to a study programme is set by the Dean.

Students will be admitted to study according to the ranking of their total scores until the planned capacity of individual study programmes in individual forms of study is full.

Dean can exempt from the entrance exam the applicants who had previously passed the entrance exam, and had been admitted and enrolled for study in person (on site) and were expelled from study.

In full-time study the entrance exam can be replaced by:

- 1. the test of General Academic Prerequisites (GAP) the candidate can be admitted to study at the Faculty of Economics in the case of having reached a percentile of 60 and higher. The GAP test can be taken within the National Comparative Exams provided by the Scio assessment centre in the academic year 2021/2022 at several places in Slovakia and the Czech Republic (the dates accepted by the Faculty will be announced on the Faculty and the Scio websites). The test can be taken more than once and the best result will be counted.
- 2. they took part in a regional round of the Economics Olympiad in 2020/2021, or in 2021/2022 they were placed in the 50th percentile of all regional rounds participants.

The applicants for part-time study will be admitted to study without entrance exam.

Admission requirements for Master's programmes

The admission requirements apply equally to all Master's programmes at the Faculty of Economics of Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica.

The basic requirement is the completion of a Bachelor's degree.

The application can be also submitted by students in their last year of Bachelor's study. It must be mentioned in in their CV and application. The candidate who fails to prove in time that he / she meets the admission requirements can be conditionally admitted to study if they do so on the day of enrolment for study at the latest.

Another requirement is to pass the entrance exam.

The entrance exam consists of a written test in major subjects of the Bachelor's degree programmes in the particular field of study. The maximum score in the entrance exam is 100 points. Students of the Finance, Banking and Investment programmes shall take a written test in the major subjects of the Bachelor's degree in the particular field of study in English.

The applicants who completed the Bachelor's degree in the same field of study shall be admitted without the entrance exam. Those who completed the Bachelor's degree in a different field of study can be admitted with or without entrance exam according to the decision of the Dean.

In case the number of applicants accepted without entrance exam is higher than the planned capacity of the study programme, Dean has the right to decide about admission according to the candidates' grade point average from Bachelor's study.

The applicants who have passed the entrance exam will be admitted to study according to a ranking compiled on the basis of their total scores up to the planned capacity of individual study programmes.

Dean can exempt from the entrance exam those applicants who had previously passed the entrance exam, and had been admitted and enrolled for study in person (on site) and were expelled from study.

Admission requirements for Doctoral programmes

All doctoral study programmes of the Economics Faculty of MBU have the same admission requirements.

The basic requirement is to have completed a Master's programme and another requirement set by the Faculty is to pass the entrance exam.

Before the admission process starts, the Faculty announces the topics of dissertation theses the candidates can choose from, each with an allocated supervisor. The candidate must choose one of the topics.

The entrance exam in full-time study is combined and consists of the following parts:

- a) Presentation of the candidate's written dissertation project in English
- b) Assessment of the candidate's research and professional activity (publications and research)
- c) Average result for the Master's study.

The maximum number of points the candidate for full-time study can achieve is 100 points.

The scoring of the entrance exam is as follows:

The entrance exam in part-time study consists of the following parts:

a) Presentation of the candidate's written dissertation project in English

b) Assessment of the candidate's research and professional activity (publications and research)
The maximum number of points the candidate for part-time study can achieve is 90 points.

b) Scientific research activity during or after completion of Master's study, e.g. a paper for student scientific conference, taking part in a research project, specialised subject-area publications 10 points

The members of the Exam Board for all study programmes are nominated by Dean of the Faculty based on the proposals from the guarantors of individual doctoral study programs. With the consent of the chair, the board can invite the supervisor whose topic has been chosen by the candidate to be a member of the board.

The candidates will be admitted to study in accordance to the ranking of their total scores until the planned capacity of individual study programmes in individual forms of study is fulfilled. On admission of the candidate to doctoral study, the Dean will notify the candidate about the topic of their dissertation, supervisor, institution providing the study, duration of study, and with full-time doctoral students, also the place of study.

ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS FOR STUDENTS

The students of the Faculty of Economics of Matej Bel University can live in a student home and take meals in a student canteen.

EMPLOYMENT OF GRADUATES

The economic education, general knowledge and practical skills and intensive language training gives the graduates of the Faculty an excellent chance to find a job at home and abroad, in economic and managerial positions of the middle and top management in tourism, companies, tax and customs offices, in the financial market and commercial banking, in public services and regional development organizations and in state and local government.

INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS WITH SPECIFIC NEEDS

The obligation of the UMB and thus also the obligation of the Faculty of Economics of UMB in Banská Bystrica is in accordance with § 100 of Act no. 131/2002 Z.z. on Higher Education Institutions and on Amendments to Certain Laws as amended and Decree No. 458/2012 on the Minimum Requirements of a Student with Specific Needs to Create Appropriate Study Conditions for Daily and External Students with Specific Needs, Due to Their Special Study Needs Without Reducing Study Requirements.

The status of a student with specific needs is given to the student:

- a) with sensory, physical and multiple disabilities (visual disability, hearing disability, limb sufferers, dysfunction of fine motor skills);
- b) with chronic diseases (cystic fibrosis, epilepsy, asthma, multiple sclerosis, diabetes mellitus, organ or tissue transplantation, cardiovascular disease, neurological disease);
- c) with health weakening (after long-term illness, convalescence, reduction in disease resistance or

tendency to recurrence);

- d) having a mental illness;
- e) with autism or other pervasive developmental disorders (e.g., Asperger syndrome);
- f) with learning disorders (dyslexia, dysortography, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, etc.).

An applicant for study with specific needs will, in sufficient time, obtain relevant information on the difficulty and admission conditions for studying in a selected study program. With the coordinator for students with specific needs at the Faculty and the Study Department, students will have a consultation about the suitability of study choice in relation to their health disability or learning disorder and its impact on the study. A student with specific needs in choosing a programme must consider the prerequisites for study in terms of knowledge, technical and personal readiness as well as motivation, content requirements, scope and form of study, conditions offered by the faculty, disability limits.

The final decision to study in a selected programme is made by the candidate. With this decision, the responsibility for any risk will be taken by the student if he/she is unable to continue in the study.

Applicants with specific needs shall, upon their application, determine the form of the admission test and the method of evaluation while taking into account the student's health disadvantage. The application for modification of the form and method for carrying out the entrance examination that will regard the student's specific needs, shall be sent to the Study Department of the Faculty, together with the relevant documentation supporting these needs.
