Course Description:

The elementary Chinese Course is fit for students who did not learn any Chinese before or Chinese beginners who can just have simple and limited communications in Chinese. This course employs a communicative approach by using real-life situations. At the same time, this course focuses on the improvement of listening, speaking, reading and writing skills, and improves the students' Chinese from all aspects.

This course will start after Oct. 28, 2019 (in the 7th week of WS) and will finish in the last week of WS in Dec. 2019. During these 7 weeks, the students can learn about 320 words and 20 common expressions. Topics covered in this course include self-introduction, asking for directions, asking preferences, seeking advices, expressing opinions, and so on. After finishing this course, students can master the basic Chinese expressions and meet the basic living needs in China. This course is trying to use innovative teaching methodology, such as games, activities and multi-media approaches to create a positive, comfort as well as challenging language learning environment to improve students' Chinese proficiency.

Course Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this course, the students will:

- Master the basic Chinese phonetics, pronunciation skills, common expressions and the basic sentence patterns.
- Master the basic strokes, stroke order and structure of the Chinese characters, be able to write all the characters learned on the class.
- Have the elementary Chinese communication skills, be able to solve simple problems arising from the everyday life and Chinese study in China.
- Be able to develop simple Chinese learning and communication strategies, acquire a brief understanding of the related Chinese culture, and have preliminary cross-cultural consciousness.

Course Requirements:

- Students must preview the new lessons before class.
- Attendance in all classes. Missing classes will affect your grades. If you cannot attend a specific class you must notify the instructor beforehand or explain your

- absence later.
- Students are expected to check email frequently so as to keep informed about course announcements.
- After class, students should review the lessons they have learned and try their best to practice what they have learned in the classes.
- Students are encouraged to increase their competency in the Chinese language and culture by pursuing opportunities of practice both on and off campus.
